#### **Clarification of News Report**

We write in response to your request for clarification on the news article under Biz Buzz column entitled "Telco positioning" published in the 21 March 2018 issue of the Philippine Daily Inquirer. The article reported in part that:

"It didn't sink in yet but the charter change approved by the shareholders of businessman Dennis Uy-led Chelsea Logistics Holdings Corp. yesterday confirmed some people's suspicion that the fast-rising tycoon from Davao is also aspiring to join the race to operate the country's third telco player.

. . . .

Some stock pundits believe that Uy has a good chance to become the local partner of China's telco players and this amendment in bylaws hints at Chelsea becoming the businessman's prospective vehicle for the telco play (or fray, as some may call it). The National Telecommunication Commission had said that the bidding might be held in the coming months and the license awarded by May, which suggests that even new players – or those without an existing license – could become the third telco.

. . . ."

We wish to clarify that as of this time the Company has not executed a definitive agreement or engagement with any party to operate as the third telecom player. The amendment in its articles of incorporation addresses the Company's intention to expand its activities to facilities related to logistics.
